June 28, 1984

The Citizen Committee met on June 28 at the Treinen residence at 8:00 p.m. Chairman Dave Cole presided.

After some discussion on what areas we should be looking at and which parcels of land in the Town of West Point are zoned agricultural. Fred Madison said he will put together base maps of the Town of West Point.

- Soil Erosion control maps
- Ground water contamination
- Depth of ground water
- Animal waste control

Hal Minkler reported on the digester for compost site. Hal also said that Mr. Irwin is willing to come and speak at a town meeting about composting in our near future.

Discussed contacting the Highway Department about plans for our roads.

It was agreed that the two key industries in the Town of West Point are agriculture and recreation. Speakers are available from the Extension office to come to meetings and talk on zoning and other related subjects.

Continue recycling

Keep volume down

Find a pick-up site for recyclables

Define what is recyclable and what is rubbish

Pure garbage to go to dumpster.

A. Recyclable:

Aluminum

Steel

Plastic

Paper

Glass

B. Rubbish:

Wood

Leaves

Brush

Binder Twine

Building Refuse

C. Garbage:

Food

Grains

The Committee recommends an ordinance for residents to separate recyclables or hire their own garbage pick-up.
