

TOWN OF WEST POINT

The town board of the Town of West Point held the regular monthly meeting on Thursday - January 4, 1990 at 8:00 p.m. at the town hall. The members present were: John Benish-Chairman, Fred Thistle-1st Supervisor, Dave Cole-2nd Supervisor, Edith Eberle-Clerk, Joan Bader-Treasurer, and Harry Sawyer-Assessor.

The meeting was published in the Lodi Enterprise and the sauk Prairie Star and posted in four places.

The minutes were read from the December 7, 1989 meeting, a motion was made by Dave Cole to approve the minutes as read, 2nd by John Benish - motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was as follows: General-\$163,586.84 (\$135,967.38 taxes), Holding Tank - \$648.47; a motion was made by Fred Thistle to approve the treasurer's report, 2nd by Dave Cole - motion carried.

The bills were presented and a motion was made by Fred Thistle to pay the bills presented, 2nd by John Benish - motion carried.

The bad check from Don Fulkerson for personal property taxes in 1988 was discussed. Chairman John Benish is going to do some checking on how to handle the bad check.

Mr. Ed Hamre came and talked to the town board and the town people that were present about Columbia county 911 system which will be ready for use in the fall of 1991. There will be a \$.96 per phone line charge per month for the first three years to help pick up the cost of the 911 system - after that there will be a \$.40 per phone line charge. The 911 system will be so you will not have to identify yourself - it will automatically come up on the computer screen. A motion was made by Dave Cole to adopt the 911 system, 2nd by Fred Thistle - motion carried. A resolution will be sent to Columbia County.

Mr. Ed Hamre also talked about Columbia county plans for a recycling center and of co-composting systems.

A motion was made by Dave cole to table the moratorium on farm lands until the February meeting, 2nd by John Benish - motion carried.

It was announced that there would be a meeting held on January 15, 1990 on the building of a new school in Sauk City.

Pine Vista's letter asking for a mobile home park license was received, a motion was made by Fred Thistle to grant the mobile home park license, 2nd by John Benish - motion carried.

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Schoepp's Cottonwood Resort letter asking for a mobile home park license was received, a motion was made by Dave cole to grant the mobile home park license, 2nd by Fred Thistle - motion carried.

As there was no correspondence from Woodlake Trails asking for a mobile home park license - a motion was made by Fred Thistle to have a registered letter sent to Bud Styer asking him to bring his monthly parking fee up to date and application for mobile home park license by the February meeting, 2nd by John Benish - motion carried.

Mr. Dick O'Connor came before the town board on behalf of Don and Bonnie Rolstad-they would like to have a access off Golf Road by O'Brien Road to allow semi-trucks to go into Badger swim pools, also of the total 6.33 acres rezoned (1 1/2 acres residential and the rest commercial). A motion was made by Dave Cole to review the survey which will be done and to take a closer look at land uses and to go on record of approving of moving the driveway, 2nd by Fred Thistle - motion carried.

A motion was made by Dave Cole to adjourn the meeting, 2nd John Benish - motion carried.
