

TOWN OF WEST POINT

Pursuant to Wisconsin State Statute 19.84, the town board of the Town of West Point held the regular monthly meeting on - Thursday, October 7, 1993 at the Town Hall at 7:30 p.m.. The town board members present were: Fred Thistle-Chairman, Alan Treinen-1st Supervisor, and A. Dave Cole-2nd Supervisor; also present were: Edith Eberle-Clerk, Joan Bader-Treasurer and Harry Sawyer-Assessor.

The meeting was published in the Lodi Enterprise and the Sauk Prairie Star and Posted in four places.

The minutes were read for the September 2, 1993 meeting. On the construction fee is no pressing issue. The transfer attendant will keep track of amounts. A motion was made by Alan Treinen to approve the minutes as read, 2nd by Fred Thistle - motion carried.

Under citizens input - Kathy Fauerbach asked who paid for the boat landing at the end of East Harmon Road. Chairman Fred Thistle stated "DNR".

The Treasurers report was \$28,532.57 in the general account. A motion was made by Alan Treinen to accept the Treasurers Report, 2nd by Dave Cole - motion carried.

The bills were presented, a motion was made by Alan Treinen to pay the bills presented, 2nd by Dave Cole - motion carried.

Chairman Fred Thistle stated that he had a letter from Columbia County stating that Blakesley and Carlson variances were approved. Dave Cole is to look into this - as he was under the impression that was not going to be approved until the two residents came before the Planning Commission.

Mr. John Fauerbach was the spokesman for a group of residents from Aleray Subdivision asking the town board to reduce the speed limit. Signs are posted at 35 miles per hour/and everyone goes faster then that/wish to have the speed limit lowered. Kathy Fauerbach read two letters from other Aleray citizens who were not present. The people would like to see 25 miles per hour for the entire road. After more discussion a motion was made by Dave Cole to have the speed limit 35 miles per hour from Hwy. 188 to the first corner (Robert Sweets) then 25 miles per hour for the remaining Aleray Subdivision, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.

There was also residents present that live on Golf Road asking to have the speed limit lower to 35 miles per hour. After discussion a motion was made by Dave Cole to lower the speed limit on Golf Road from 45 miles per hour to 35 miles per hour, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.

The resolution presented for borrowing money was not correct so a motion was made by Dave Cole to table the resolution, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.

The sign that is posted on East Harmon Road about Boat Landing is closed has been worked - a few people have been given the OK to use it by Chairman Fred Thistle. The construction on the new boat landing is almost completed.

Two bids for reassessment of the Town of West Point were received, one from Gardiner Appraisal Service for \$24,900.00, and one from Associated Appraisal for \$39,900. After discussion a motion was made by Dave Cole to have Harry Sawyer - Assessor contact Gardiner Appraisal and bring his recommendation back to the town board at the budget meeting, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.

A motion was made by Dave Cole to have the budget meeting on October 21, 1993 at 7:30 p.m. at the Clerk's home, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.

Mr. Bill Pratt and Mr. Sid Commings would like to purchase the lake access (60 ft. wide) on Trails End. Discussion followed - the town board can not sell town property - therefore it will have to be brought up at the Annual Town Meeting in April for the citizens decision.

Chairman Fred Thistle gave a report on 911 - burglar alarms are setting off false alarms and each one has to be checked out. They (911) would like a list of people to contact if the alarms goes off and also would like each person that has a burglar alarm to make application (which would include people to contact). The property owner will be billed each call that is made to the property. The town board gave their input and agreeded with the proposed guidelines. **for the third + more alarms*

Chairman Fred Thistle gave a report on the town bridge - Mr. Meier has referred the bridge to Tim Larson from DNR and no meeting date has been set up - if used there is federal bridge funds available the cost to us would be \$1,000.00.

Crow's appliance will not sign a letter that the hauler would like to have signed stating that the appliance had been taken care of because it was not stated clearly - the question was brought up to put the hauling of used appliances out on bid.

A motion was made by Alan Treinen that the Recycling Center will be closed on December 25 and January 1st and that John Sweeney will receive two days of paid vacation, 2nd by Dave Cole - motion carried.

The final certified survey for Miller Court was signed by the town chairman - the town engineer has given is OK.

The letter was signed for Garden Bluff Association.

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Dave Cole has asked Pat Schuknecht to due a brief history of the Town of West Point for the beginning of the land use plan that the planning commission is working on.

We did not go into close session.

A motion was made by Alan Treinen to adjourn the meeting, 2nd by Dave Cole - motion carried.
