

TOWN OF WEST POINT

Pursuant to Wisconsin State Statute 19.84, the town board of the Town of West Point held the regular monthly meeting on January 5, 1995 at the Town Hall at 7:30 p.m.. The town board members present were: Fred Thistle-Chairman, Alan Treinen-1st Supervisor, and A. Dave Cole-2nd Supervisor; also present were: Edith Eberle-Clerk, Joan Bader-Treasurer and Harry Sawyer-Assessor.

The meeting was published in the Lodi Enterprise and the Sauk Prairie Star and Posted in four places.

Under Citizens Input - a complaint on taxes.

The minutes were read for the December 1, 1994 meeting. A motion was made by Dave Cole with correction to approve the minutes as read, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.

The Treasurers report was \$761,569.00 as of January 4, 1995 in the general account - includes taxes. A motion was made by Alan Treinen to accept the Treasurers Report, 2nd by Dave Cole - motion carried.

The bills were presented, a motion was made by Alan Treinen to pay the bills presented, 2nd by Dave Cole - motion carried.

There is a meeting on January 9, at Columbia County Highway - which the Town Chairman is going to attend. A letter was received from Columbia County Zoning stating that they have changed their decision on Roger Ballweg land and will rezone the land.

The planning commission report as follows - Myron Sharkey was present and very concerned about his neighbor Mr. Zerler developing more land residential. Mitchel Greimel complaint about having no public assess to his property. Dennis Bender and Edgar Walsh have 36 acres that they would like to develop residential - to the next planning commission.

The following applications for mobile home park licenses were presented: Pine Vista - 66 mobile homes, Schoepps - 57, and Crystal Lake 174 mobiles homes and travel trailers. A motion was made by Alan Treinen to grant 1995 licenses for the three mobile home parks, 2nd by Dave Cole - motion carried.

Chairman Fred Thistle presented copies of the Uniform Dwelling Code, Control Access to Town Highways Building Permit Fees and an explanation on the letter that was drawn up for residents that were not in compliance with the Erosion Control Ordinance. Copies of everything from the town lawyer will be made and be given to planning commission members.

A motion was made by Dave Cole to table the letter that would be sent to builders on Erosion Control Problems ~~was tabled~~ until February 2, 1995, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.

Mr. Jack Heal and Fire Chief Wickham from the Lodi Fire Department gave the following report:

Crystal Lake - no violation
Buchanan Mini Garages - need 2 fire extinguishers
Rasmussen and Associates - no violation
Slack Jams and Jellies - no violation
Darrell Klingemeyer - no violation
Lake Wisconsin Boat Club - no violation
Town Hall - no violation
O'Aces - no violation
Hickory Hills - fire extinguishers needs to be checked
and violation of locked door

After discussion on the violation of Hickory Hills locked exit (if turned into DILHR the fine would be \$1500 per day) a motion was made by Dave Cole to have the town chairman contact Alice Elser immediately to correct the problem, also the Town of West Point has a nuisance ordinance that could be enforced of public safety - to made a permanent solution to the locked door during business hours, also to contact Bob Buchanan to get fire extinguishers put in at the mini warehouses, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.


Chairman Fred Thistle read a statement on weight limits on the town roads that he is going to take to the Columbia County Highway Department meeting on January 9, 1995, After the Columbia County meeting the statement will be put in the papers.

Mr. C.M. (Dave) Davis and Mr. Keith Rumisek are interested in the Recycling superintendent. After discussion a motion was made by Dave Cole to have Keith Rumisek be the main recycling superintendent and Dave Davis be the relief recycling superintendent, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried

Mr. Joe Castanza has left Mead and Hunt as of December 31, 1994 and going into business on his own under the name of Municipal Engineering and Inspection Services. Mr. Castanza asked to have the Town of West Point to go with his new business - he would promise lower rates and the same service as before. In two weeks he and two other people are going to take the building inspector test to become certified inspectors. The Town of West Point could then have Municipal Engineering and Inspection Service issue building permits and also to the inspections. A motion was made by Dave Cole to hire Municipal Engineering and Inspection Service as a temporary as the Town Engineer, 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried. We will put Municipal Engineering and Inspection Service on our February agenda.

A user fee at the recycling center was discussed - (large white goods and use of a construction dumpster). It is tabled until the February 2 meeting.

A motion was made by Dave Cole to adjourn the meeting at 10:20 p.m., 2nd by Alan Treinen - motion carried.
